Brennan called the meeting to order at 7:33 a.m.

Meeting quorum was not met.

General Public Comment

No General Public Comment.

Business

23TP019 – Approve the 2024 Unified Planning Work Program – Draft Report. Brennan reviewed the 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) draft report. This document includes the annual activities, planning studies, and products to be developed by the Metropolitan Planning Organization for 2024. The Unified Planning Work Program also identifies funding and staffing for conducting these tasks. Discussion ensued.

No action was taken on this item.

23TP020 – Approve the Rapid City Area Metropolitan Planning Organization Draft Operations Plan. The Operations Plan is a guiding document for all transportation products and plans required through the Metropolitan Planning Organization process. Brennan reviewed the revisions to this plan.

No action was taken on this item.

23TP021 – Approve the Citizens Advisory Committee Bylaw Update. Staff is currently in the process of revising Rapid City Area Metropolitan Planning Organization's Operations Plan to update language that references the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), the new highway bill signed by the President on November 15, 2021. As part of the Operations Plan changes, staff is also proposing revisions to the Citizens Advisory Committee Bylaws. These changes ensure that the process used by Meade County to appoint committee representation is accurately reflected, and that any member

of the public participating in a committee meeting that is not a “voting member” is considered a “non-voting member.” Brennan reviewed this update. Discussion ensued.

No active was taken on this item.

23TP024 – Approve the Letter of Support for the City of Rapid City’s Transportation Alternatives Grant Application. The City of Rapid City is submitting an application to assist with funding the reconstruction of trails in Mary Hall Park. The estimated cost of the project is \$1,075,786.61. Through this SDDOT grant program, the City of Rapid City could receive 81.95% of the project cost, or \$881,607.30, with the City providing matching funds in the amount of \$194,179.51. The MPO’s support may enhance the City’s potential to receive this grant. Brennan reviewed this letter of support. Discussion ensued.

No action was taken on this item.

23TP025 – Acknowledge the Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Plan 2023 Annual Update. The Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan was approved in March 2019 and identifies the gaps and needs in transportation related to persons with disabilities, seniors and individuals with low incomes. The plan provides strategies to fix these gaps and needs, followed by priorities for implementing these strategies. An inventory of participating transportation providers was also provided. Agencies interested in receiving federal funds to help pay for vehicles, such as buses or vans, participated in this locally developed, coordinated public transit - human services transportation plan. This Annual Update identifies the 2023 accomplishments and on-going tasks as well as those not yet initiated and/or scheduled for the coming years. The Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Plan will be updated in 2024 per the 2024 Unified Planning Work Program. Brennan reviewed this update. Discussion ensued.

No action was taken on this item.

23TP026 – Approve the Urbanized Area Boundary – Final Map. The attached map identifies the proposed Rapid City Urban Boundary. Based on the new criteria, this new boundary incorporates additional areas in the cities of Rapid City, Piedmont, Summerset, Box Elder, the Black Hawk community, and Ellsworth Air Force Base. Some additional minor adjustments were also made to incorporate the anticipated twenty-year growth areas. The urbanized area boundary, once finalized, provides the boundary for the Functional Class Map, which in turn will identify which road projects can utilize Federal funding allocated to the Rapid City Area Metropolitan Planning Organization. Once the Rapid City Urbanized Boundary is approved, changes to the Functional Class Map and the Metropolitan Planning Organization boundary are forthcoming. Dean reviewed this map. Discussion ensued.

No action was taken on this item.

23TP027 – Acknowledge the 2023-2023 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #23-004A . This amendment implements a staff recommended change from a statewide project to a region-wide project to install dynamic message boards along the Interstate Highway system. There is no change in the proposed funding for Project CR

000S(418) in the Interstate Maintenance category in FY2023. Brennan reviewed this amendment.

No action was taken on this item.

23TP028 – Approve the Letter of Support for SDDOT Exit 46 Reconnecting Communities Grant Application. The SDDOT is seeking Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods Grant Program funding for the Interstate 90 Exit 46 Bridge Reconstruction Project. The current interchange at Elk Creek Road is a considerable barrier to access and mobility for the rural communities of Piedmont and Summerset, in Meade County. The project includes reconstructing the Exit 46 (Elk Creek Road) bridge to include multimodal facilities for those walking and biking, eliminating an at-grade railroad crossing of Elk Creek Road, as well as regrading and resurfacing both directions of I-90 from east of Exit 44 to west of Exit 48. The new structure will address and correct existing unsafe conditions at the ramp terminals and intersections and accommodate future expansion of I-90. The total construction cost of the project is estimated to be \$56.3 million and is scheduled for letting in 2025. The Department is seeking 80% (\$45 million) of the project cost from the Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods Grant Program and providing 20% (\$11.3 million) in local match.

No action was taken on this item.
